What is different about SSH?

- Little formal IP (patents)
- Fewer role models, cases.
- Unclear pathways (TRL, Clinical Phases...)
- Less 'dramatic' investment needed
- Returns less obvious
- Timescales tend to be longer.

The SSH academic 'entrepreneur'

- Driven by (passion for) impact.
- Funding is a means to that end.
- Wants to *create* value – less concerned about *capturing* value
- Highly dependent on informal relationships:
 - Both a strength (robust, aligned incentives)
 - And a weakness (implicit joint ownership)
- Ambition?

But there is real value

- Assets include:
 - Reputation
 - Brand, trademark
 - Relationships (including team)
 - Data, results, contacts
 - Robust software
- The work of a decade to build
- All result from successful ‘commercialisation’
- Who owns the assets?

How to help

- Identify those who are focused on impact
- Be a 'light touch' Commercial Director
 - Encourage, be a sounding board
 - Protect assets
 - Find small (enabling) sums of money
- Inject ambition:
 - Scale (soft to hard product)
 - Start charging where you can
 - Introduce potential commercial partners
